Year 2/3 fun

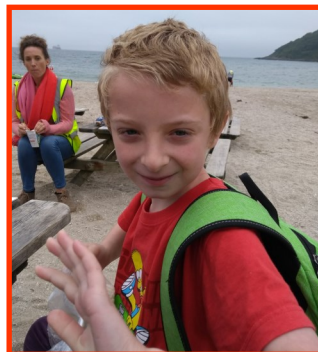
