Early Years Foundation Stage

86% (6 out of 7) of our Reception children achieved a ‘**Good Level of Development**’ compared to a National average of **52%** and a Cornwall average of **59%**. The school’s average score was **34.9** compared to a National average of **32.8** and a Cornwall average of **34.1**.

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

At the end of Year 1 children complete a phonics check; this is to check the children’s understanding of phonics (reading).
