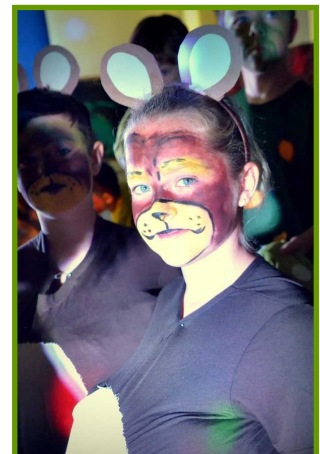
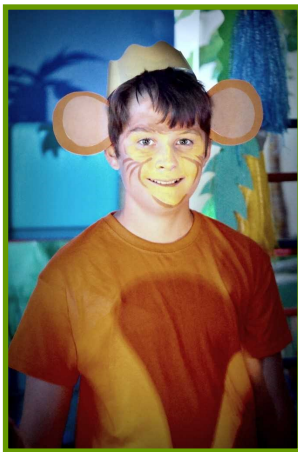
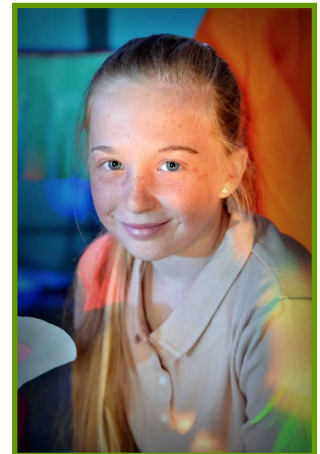
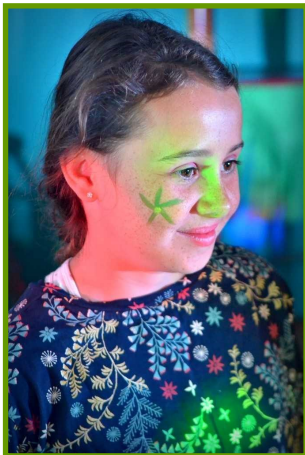




Jungle book
