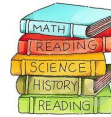
Welcome

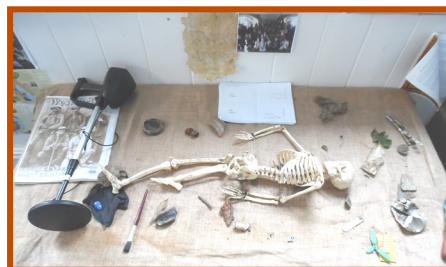
