Tips for Seesaw.



We are so impressed with how hard everyone is working on Seesaw and the activities we are seeing show a lot of creativity and patience.

We have put together some top tips that we have found make things even easier:

If you click on activities, you will see sections for 'done' and 'in progress'. In progress are those saved as drafts and those that have been returned to you for improvement.

If an adult has added a comment to support your learning, you can see this by clicking on inbox and the notifications. You will see an image of the activity and the comment. Click to read it and follow advice given.

Worksheets and templates can be unlocked by clicking on the three dots on the image. Unlocking means you can zoom in on questions to answer easier. Using a stylus is also quicker if you are using a tablet. We have ordered some to school and if you would like one please let the office know.

Worksheets and templates can also be printed at home. When in the activity you will see a 'view original' button. Clicking this will allow you to print the document.

Half term activities.

We will not be setting activities on Seesaw during the inset day or over half term. Thursday the 11th of February will be a 'catch-up' day so all activities can be archived over half term. If you need activities then the children will still have access to Sumdog, Nessy, TT Rockstars and the other apps on Wonde as well as the workbooks sent home.
