We have acted out the story and then written a retell in our own words. We are now developing our understanding of using paragraphs and punctuating speech accurately in our writing before we begin to explore writing alternative versions of the Bopuluchi story.



We have developed our knowledge of ancient civilisations in History, exploring what 'civilisation' means and the features needed to make these successful. We explored maps and atlases to locate the Indus Valley ancient civilisation and the Indus River upon which it depended.
